The memories that we have been blessed with and will cherish forever and always; the memories that we cling to that will help us to always honour Rance and the gift of unconditional love that he has given to us. Rance loved to draw numbers, letters, characters, you name it! Unfortunately, our talented artist never liked to save his art work!
